

Through his work at Carrot Creative, Mike has been able to provide his expertise to leading brands such as MLB.com, MTV, The Onion.com and Unilever providing strategic insight on how these companies can enhance their social media presence and online identity.

Jay Parkinson, Hello Health: Jay Parkinson is a physician who lives in Williamsburg, Brooklyn. He was trained at Johns Hopkins in preventive

medicine and pediatrics. He realized just what a mess the health care system is, with messy delivery processes and frustrating, expensive reimbursement methods and figured the whole thing could change for the simpler. In January of 2008, Jay joined a company called Myca to build his prescription: "a Facebook-like platform that uses technology, from IM to video chat, to restore the traditional doctor-patient relationship that has been lost in today's high-pressure, high-volume, eight-minute-appointment practice model, which is often blamed for the shortage of primary-care physicians. It's part electronic medical record, part practice-management system, and part social-networking site, complete with profiles and photos of doctors and patients, all in a secure environment that complies with federal privacy standards."


Inter Ivy Progressive Networking Dinner |

Book Group Luncheon: Olive Kitteridge |

by Elizabeth Strout (Pulitzer prize winner)

Monday, September 21st, 12:00 noon. Anyone who gets in the way of *Olive Kitteridge*, redoubtable seventh-grade math teacher in Crosby, Maine, had better watch out, for she crashes unapologetically through life like an emotional storm

trooper. She forces her husband, Henry, the town pharmacist, into tactical retreat; and she drives her beloved son, Christopher, across the country and into therapy. But appalling as Olive can be, Strout manages to make her deeply human and even sympathetic, as are all of the characters in this "novel in stories." Covering a period of 30-odd years, most of the stories feature Olive as their focus, but in some she is bit player or even a footnote while other characters take center stage to sort through their own fears and insecurities. Though loneliness and loss haunt these pages, Strout also supplies gentle humor and a nourishing dose of hope. People are sustained by the rhythms of ordinary life and the natural wonders of coastal Maine, and even Olive is sometimes caught off guard by life's baffling beauty. Isabel Katzin leads discussion over a catered lunch.



Following these sun safety tips both all year round and especially during outdoor summer activities can help prevent serious skin damage, and reduce your risk for skin cancer.
