## IN MEMORIAM Christopher H. Browne, C'69

On December 13, 2009, the Penn Club of New York lost one of its most supportive and generous members when Chris Browne passed away. Chris' vision, dedication and unwavering belief in the Penn Club are responsible for the Club being what it is today. The strength and vibrancy of the Penn Club is certainly one of Chris Browne's greatest legacies.

Chris was a Charter Member of the Penn Club, a Founder Donor, a founding Director, and was instrumental in the development of the Clubhouse. He served as the second President of the Penn Club for nine years, and filled the role of its very first House Committee Chair. He was generous with both his time and financial resources as it related to the University and the Penn Club. The Club was the beneficiary of Chris' generosity with the Christopher Browne Library in the Ben Franklin Living Room.

Beginning with his days as an undergraduate history major, Chris was actively engaged with the University of Pennsylvania for more than 40 years. First elected as a member of the Board of Overseers of the School of Arts and Sciences in 1982, Chris was named chairman of the board in 1999 and held that position for a decade. He was then appointed Chair Emeritus. He was honored with the SAS Dean's Medal in March, 2009. Chris became a member of the University's Board of Trustees in 1991 and became a charter trustee in 2001. During his 18 year tenure, Chris impacted Penn through service on a wide range of Trustee committees, including the Executive, Academic Policy, Budget and Finance, Compensation, and Facilities and Campus Planning Committees; the Investment Board and the Proxy Subcommittee. Chris also served as a Co-chair of Penn's Making History Campaign. He was also a member of the Board of Directors of Penn Alumni, where he served on the Nominations and Programming Committees.

Chris also will long be remembered for his extraordinary generosity to Penn. While his professional focus was in finance, his passion for the liberal arts guided his philanthropy. In 2007, he made a gift of \$15 million to the School of Arts and Sciences — the largest single gift ever made to SAS — to fund five highly prestigious professorships. This very generous commitment followed a \$10 million gift from Chris to SAS in 2000, also to endow five professorships. Chris created these chairs, known as the Browne Distinguished Professorships, to embody his firm belief that academic distinction should be defined by exceptional research, superior



teaching, and a dedication to making Penn a leading forum for open dialogue. It is highly fitting that his name will be forever linked with some of Penn's finest scholar-teachers (including President Amy Gutmann who serves as the Christopher H. Browne Distinguished Professor of Political Science).

In all of his involvements, Chris brought an unwavering commitment to Penn and a wide-ranging mix of personal, academic and professional interests. As fellow members of his community, we will deeply miss his friendship, insights and his wonderful sense of humor.

A true renaissance man, with a keen wit and deep dedication to great debate, Chris devoted himself to a host of causes and hobbies. Chris was an amateur architect and landscape architect. He was a member of the Council on The National Trust for Historic Preservation and served on the Board of Directors of the Institute of Classical Architecture. He was also a trustee

at The Rockefeller University, where he served on the Executive Committee and as Chair of the Development Committee and the Nominating and Governance Committee. At Rockefeller, he established the Christopher H. Browne Center for Immunology and Immune Diseases in 1997. He was a member of the New York City Council of the Brookings Institution, a board member of the Paley Center for Media in New York, and a trustee of the Long Island Chapter of the Nature Conservancy and of Guild Hall, a regional arts and education center in East Hampton, New York.

Chris spent his entire career at the private investment firm of Tweedy, Browne Company, where he was a managing director and a member of the firm's management committee. He also served as president of the Tweedy, Browne Funds, a mutual funds group, and was a general partner in TKB Partners and Vanderbilt Partners. A frequent speaker on behavioral psychology and financial decision-making, he served on the faculty of Harvard's John F. Kennedy School of Government's program in Investment Decisions and Behavioral Finance. In 2006, he authored "The Little Book of Value Investing" (and held a signing at the Penn Club).

Chris Browne was one of those rare individuals who touched the lives of so many individuals in his wide ranging circles. He will be sadly missed and fondly remembered.

We offer our sincerest condolences to his family and friends, and especially his partner, Andrew S. Gordon, C'83.



### **Wolf Hall** | by Hilary Mantel

**Monday, March 22nd, noon.** In the ruthless arena of King Henry VIII's court, only one man dares to gamble his life to win the king's favor and ascend to the heights of political power. England in the 1520s is a heartbeat from disaster. If the king dies without a male heir, the country could be destroyed by civil war. Henry VIII wants

to annul his marriage of twenty years, and marry Anne Boleyn. The pope and most of Europe opposes him. The quest for the king's freedom destroys his adviser, the brilliant Cardinal Wolsey, and leaves a power vacuum. Into this impasse steps Thomas Cromwell. Cromwell is a wholly original man, a charmer and a bully, both idealist and opportunist, astute in reading people and a demon of energy: he is also a consummate politician, hardened by his personal losses, implacable in his ambition. But Henry is volatile: one day tender, one day murderous. Cromwell helps him break the opposition, but what will be the price of his triumph? In inimitable style, Hilary Mantel presents a picture of a half-made society on the cusp of change, where individuals fight or embrace their fate with passion and courage. With a vast array of characters, overflowing with incident, the novel re-creates an era when the personal and political are separated by a hairbreadth, where success brings unlimited power but a single failure means death.

### **Too Much Happiness** | by Alice Munro

**Monday, April 19th, noon.** Munro's latest collection is satisfyingly true to form and demonstrates why she continues to garner laurels (such as this year's Man Booker International Prize). Through carefully crafted situations, Munro breathes arresting life into her characters, their relationships and their traumas. In Wenlock Edge, a college

student in London, Ontario, acquires a curious roommate in Nina, who tricks the narrator into a revealing dinner date with Nina's paramour, the significantly older Mr. Purvis. *Child's Play*, a dark story about children's capacity for cruelty and the longevity of their secrets, introduces two summer camp friends, Marlene and Charlene, who form a pact against the slightly disturbing Verna, whose family used to share Marlene's duplex. The title, and final, story, the collection's longest and most ambitious, takes the reader to 19th-century Europe to meet Sophia Kovalevski, a talented mathematician and novelist who grapples with the politics of the age and the consequences of success. While this story lacks some of the effortlessness found in Munro's finest work, the collection delivers what she's renowned for: poignancy, flesh and blood characters and a style nothing short of elegant.

Teens are growing up in a city where affluence is more dense and prevalent than any other city; their media preferences and influences (e.g., Gossip Girl), as well as celebrity idols that lead a fast life whose chronicles are virtual (e.g., Miley Cyrus, Lindsay Lohan, the Hilton sisters and many more) promote indulgent behavior, supporting their "entitlement" attitudes and further feeding into and spreading "af-fluenza".

Our diverse panel of distinguished experts will explore these factors and more in an attempt to help parents prevent and cure this epidemic.


