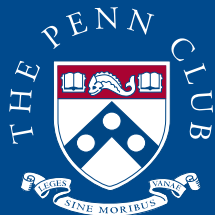

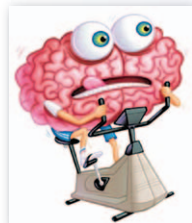

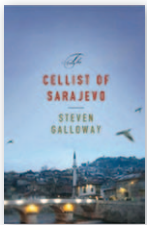

Brooklyn Bridge and Tribeca |

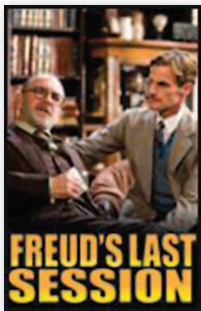

Norfolk Yacht and Country Club Norfolk, Virginia



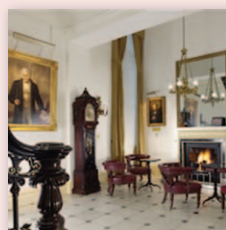

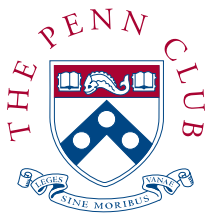

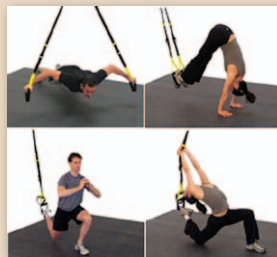
